- + Through *Justice Industries**



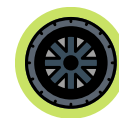
PAPER SHREDDING

- + Take to *Office Depot** or *Staples**
- + Compost
- + Free shredding service available at the Material Recovery Facility on Tuesdays >>



TIRES

- + At the Williamson County Landfill, 5750 Pinewood Road. Williamson County residents can recycle up to 6 passenger vehicle tires a day.



FOOD SCRAPS

- + Sign up for compost collection with local companies:
 - Regenr8
 - Compost Nashville
 - The Compost Company (Commercial spaces only)
 - + Start a backyard compost pile
 - Compost items like cardboard, paper, fruit & vegetable scraps, egg shells, bread, paper towels, paper plates, natural fibers (cotton, wool, linen), and pet & undyed human hair
